

Maintenance on the digital press has caused some delay in printing; however, Moses and Titus continue to translate Module 3 of the *Character Code for Life* curriculum. Missionary Ernie Hopper took 1,200 children's books to Uganda when he went there earlier in July.

They are continuing to prepare the *Lord* of *Kings* VBS series for printing. When proofreading and translating the songs are completed, they will begin printing. We are praying for funds to print up to ten thousand children's leaflets for the churches in Kenya.

Moses and Titus will attend and distribute literature at the African Baptist Association (ABA) in late August. They also hope to have feedback to make improvements on the literature.

God has truly blessed the work in Kenya with these two men. They have both enrolled in online courses in Texas Baptist Institute and Seminary. They hope to receive degrees in theology and Christian education. This will equip them for the ministry of providing literature for the churches of East Africa. The Backpack Ministry in the Philippines has become a blessing with the twenty churches participating, sending reports of children making professions of faith and studying the *CCfL* lessons faithfully.

Backpacks are needed by October 15.

We found it necessary to pay about \$7,000 in taxes and late fees to the local government, that we only recently learned about. It is important to operate legally under the laws and regulations of each nation in which we have ministry as much as possible.

Canada

While the civil war continues, Jacob Tubal continues the work of translating, printing and distributing *CCfL* curriculum. Jacob's brother, Steven, a war refugee now living in the Philippines, has enrolled online in Texas Baptist Seminary. He will major in Christian education so he can become a vital part of the ministry in Myanmar when he returns home.

Filipino missionary Jonathan Tejada, working in Vancouver, Canada, reports that they are enjoying ICP's *God's Character and Me* Sunday school literature for teens and adults. They are currently studying Module 1, *God Is...* Please pray for missionary Tejada and this growing mission as they move into a more permanent building.

Mexico

Dr. Hugo Mallozzi has helped ICP deliver *CCfL* literature to three first-time user churches in Mexico. Spanish is one of the most spoken languages in the world, and we have most of the *CCfL* curriculum translated in Spanish. We are praying that God will guide the ministry in expanding in each country in Latin America. Translator Gabriel Sanchez, who is now a missionary in Columbia, is helping distribute the material there.



Translation of our 9-year *Character Code for Life* curriculum is complete in Swahili (being distributed in four African nations) and Russian (being used in Belarus). *CCfL* is near completion in Spanish (being distributed in Colombia, Mexico and Ecuador) and Burmese (being used throughout Myanmar). Translation

into Tagalog (used throughout the Philippines) and Romanian are both at the halfway mark. Prayerfully, they will be completed soon.

Lord of Kings and Master of the Sea VBS have both been translated, printed and distributed in the Philippines. Lord of Kings has also been translated into the Spanish, Swahili and Burmese languages
