Food and Drink or Righteousness and Peace: Which Will You Choose?

Romans 14:17-19



¹⁷ For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. ¹⁸ Whoever thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and approved by men. ¹⁹ So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding.

There are those who think life is all about food and drink, entertainment and recreation. There is a place for all these things, but the essence of life is doing the right things, enjoying peace, and prizing the joy found in living out the principles of God's righteousness.

Deciding good and bad or clean and unclean is a matter of considering the holiness of God. Respect for fellow Christians should guide us in making such decisions. In the above Scripture, Paul, by the inspiration of God, helps us understand real joy is choosing to prioritize those things which build up those in our circle of influence.

New School for Burmese Churches Around the World

God has opened another door to carry the gospel to the lost people of the world! Thang Sian has invited me to help with an online Bible school for pastors and missionaries of the Burmese people. Pastor Thang came to the United States to establish a church among his people who have settled as a community in the Grand Rapids, Michigan area. When he learned about the ABA association of churches he was convicted about many of the things practiced by the group of Baptists from Myanmar. When he asked me for help with his desire, I was able to put him in touch with Pastor Nate Lowe, of Madison Avenue Missionary Baptist Church, Kentwood, Michigan. The church has endorsed Thang as a missionary of the ABA.



It was exciting to participate in the initial online meeting of the students. One hundred fifteen Burmese students, representing Myanmar, Malaysia, Australia, Thailand, India, China, Singapore, and five states in the United States, joined the meeting. These students are pastors, teachers or missionaries in their adopted countries. Please pray for Thang, his sending church, and those who will be teaching these highly dedicated students from around the world.
